

A ydych yn barod am gofrestru proffesiynol?



A ydych yn gweithio fel cynorthwywr cymorth dysgu mewn ysgol neu sefydliad addysg bellach?

A wyddoch, o Ebrill 2016 ymlaen, bydd rhaid ichi gofrestru gyda Chyngor y Gweithlu Addysg i Gymru (www.ewc.wales)?

Os ydych yn gweithio fel cynorthwywr cymorth dysgu, cewch eich cofrestru fel mater o drefn gan eich cyflogwr a didynnir ffi cofrestru flynyddol o £15 o'ch cyflog. Nid oes gennych unrhyw ddewis ynglŷn â hyn. Ein dealltwriaeth ni yw y bydd athrawon a darlithwyr colegau yn talu £45.

Fel y gweithwyr sy'n cael y cyflog isaf mewn ysgolion a cholegau, barn UNSAIN yw na ddylech orfod talu am eich cofrestriad. Byddwn yn dal i ymgyrchu'n weithredol i gael cynghorau i dalu'r ffi cofrestru drosoch.

A ddylwn i boeni ynghylch cofrestru?

Mae cael eich 'cofrestru' yn golygu y byddwch yn atebol yn broffesiynol, fel athrawon, beth bynnag fo'ch hyfforddiant, eich cymwysterau neu eich cyflog.

Ar hyn o bryd, nid oes unrhyw ofynion statudol ynghylch cymwysterau ar gyfer staff cymorth dysgu ac mae safonau'n amrywio o ysgol i ysgol. Ond yn y dyfodol, dylai cofrestru olygu symudiad tuag at safonau proffesiynol cydnabyddedig. Mae UNSAIN yn gweithio gyda Llywodraeth Cymru ynghylch safonau rolau cynorthwywyr addysgu.

Mae UNSAIN yn credu y byddai safonau proffesiynol yn gam cadarnhaol a dylai hyn gael ei adlewyrchu mewn cyflog a chydabyddiaeth gwell am eich gwaith.

O Ebrill 2016 ymlaen cewch eich cwmpasu gan cod ymddygiad yn yr un modd ag athrawon.

Ni fydd y cod yn gymwys i chi tan fis Ebrill 2016, ond gofynnwch i UNSAIN am gyngor os ydych yn ansicr neu os ydych yn poeni am unrhyw beth yn y cod. Os nad ydych yn aelod o UNSAIN eto gallwch ymuno â ni heddiw.

Ond bydd cofrestru hefyd yn golygu risg a chyfrifoldeb cynyddol. Os byddwch yn torri'r cod ymddygiad gall Cyngor y Gweithlu Addysg eich disgyblu. Os daw i'r gwaethaf gallech gael eich diarddel o'r proffesiwn. Mae bron iawn pob athro a phrifathro yn aelodau o undeb gan eu bod yn deall bod hyn yn rhoi diogelwch iddynt **achredwn y dylech chi fod yn aelod o undeb hefyd.**



Pam ymuno ag UNSAIN

Are you ready for professional registration?



Do you work in a learning support role in a school or further education institution?

Did you know that from April 2016 you will have to register with the Education Workforce Council for Wales (www.ewc.wales)?

If you work in a learning support role you will be automatically registered by your employer and an annual registration fee of £15 will be deducted from your salary. You have no choice about this. Our understanding is that teachers and college lecturers will pay £45.

As the lowest paid workers in school and colleges, UNISON's view is that you should not have to pay for your registration. We will continue to actively campaign to get councils to pay the registration fee for you.

Should I be worried about registration?

Being 'registered' means you will be professionally accountable, like teachers, regardless of your training, qualifications or salary.

At the moment there are no standard qualification requirements for learning support staff and standards differ from school to school. But in future, registration should mean a move towards recognised professional standards. UNISON is working with the Welsh Government on standards for teaching assistant roles.

UNISON believes professional standards would be a positive step and should be reflected in better pay and recognition for what you do.

From April 2016 you will be covered by a code of conduct in the same way as teachers are.

The code won't apply to you until April 2016, but please ask UNISON

for advice if you are unsure or worried about anything in the code. If you're not a member of UNISON yet you can join us today.

Registration is an acknowledgement that you are a professional, valued member of the school team who deserves the same respect as teaching colleagues.

But registration also brings increased risk and responsibility. If you fall foul of the code of conduct the Education Workforce Council can discipline you. In the worst case you could be struck off from the profession. Almost all teachers and head teachers are in a union because they understand that it gives them protection and we think you should be in a union too.
